Explanation of Statement on Vote sheets

- Statement on Vote or "yellow sheets" are used when you intended to vote a different way than was recorded.
- Filling out one of these does not affect the outcome of the recorded vote, it is just a statement of how you intended to vote.
- These are called grey sheets in the House of Delegates.
- Your statement will be reflected on LIS as a paragraph after the vote listing. An example has been provided below.
- If you need a "yellow sheet" just come up to the Chamber desk and we will provide it.
- Once your form is complete please return it to the Chamber desk.
- "Yellow sheets" can only be turned in until the end of the session day.
